# NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

#### 1. <u>Content</u>.

The journal is directed primarily to Lawyers in the Commonwealth Caribbean, but articles relating to general (non-regional) legal problems, international and comparative law, international relations and Caribbean socio-political issues may also be considered.

## 2. Articles

Should be typed in English, 10 characters per inch, double spaced on one side of the paper only. One inch margins should be left at the top, bottom, left and right sides of the paper, pages should be numbered serially. Authors should submit at least two copies, one, the top copy thoroughly revised. The title of the article, the author's name and a biographical note on him/her should be typed on the flysheet.

## 3. Footnotes:

Footnotes should be numbered consecutively and should be typed double spaced 10 characters per inch on a separate sheet appended at the end of the article.

## 4. Length:

Articles should not exceed 10, 000 words and case notes and book reviews should not exceed 1,500 words. The Editor may agree to split larger articles between different issues.

#### 5. Book Review:

A book review heading should appear as follows: Title, author, publisher, place, date, also pagination and price if available.

## 6. Originality

The contribution must be the author's original work and should not have been offered for general publication elsewhere. Conference papers not otherwise published will be considered for publication.

## 7. Copyright:

The copyright in the article shall reside in the publishers on the articles being accepted for publication in the Journal.

## 8. <u>Copies</u>

The Journal will provide one free copy to the contributor of the issue in which the article appears. Additional copies may be purchased from the Journal.

## 9. Style & Reference:

Authors shall as far as possible follow the principles of citation and style recommended by **A Uniform System of Citation** published by the Harvard Law Review Association.
